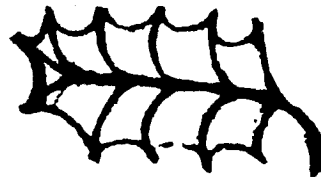

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MEANING OF THE NAME

The surname Hollingsworth is derived from a place in northeast Cheshire, of the same name, supposedly the place called "Holisurde" in the Domesday Book for Cheshire, and pronounced "Hollis-worth," but probably intended to be "Hollinworth." It is in the Parish of Mottram-in-Longdendale, a few miles south of Manchester. It is possible that several separate families using this place as a surname came into existence at an early day. There are also two other places with this name in Lancashire north of Manchester. The Cheshire place was barren, and called waste at the time of Domesday (1086) and it was not until about the time of Magna Carta (1215) that we find any person using the name as a personal family name. This was "Tomas De Holinewurth" (here the name is transliterated into Latin) who was a signatory on a charter of about that period. The two Anglo-Saxon words, Holegn (or Holyn), a Holly bush, and Worp (or Worde) meaning an enclosure, or farmstead, are said to be the origin of the name for this place now called Hollingsworth in Cheshire, or, "A farm (homestead) enclosed by holly bushes," or simply "Holly Farm." In later centuries a medial "s" came to be used by some of the families, but not as a general rule earlier than 1620. There are now five generally used forms: Hollingsworth, Hollinsworth, Hollingworth, Hollinworth and Hollandsworth. These are regularly found in the indexes to vital records from 1837 at St. Catherine's House, London and in most telephone or city directories for large cities in England and America.

INTENT OF THIS QUARTERLY

Hollingsworth Register is now entering its eleventh year of publication. It started in April, 1965, and its purpose remains as it was at that time: To publish verbatim copies or abstracts of records of the family world wide from the earliest times to the present day. Nearly every name of our family from the U.S. Census, 1790 through 1860, has been published here. About 1,700,000 pages of census were scoured to produce that result. We think no other family has thus been served.

Will of Benjamin Hollingsworth
of
Benton County, Alabama - 1841

Your editor has tried for years to obtain this will. It is designated a "floating" will in the Index to Alabama Wills. This means it is not registered in any surviving will book, although it was at one time, but that book is lost. It was destroyed during the American Civil War. This is the original document we are transcribing verbatim from a Xerox copy purchased from the present custodians, the Department of Archives, Montgomery, Alabama, Milo B. Howard, Jr., Director. The cost was only \$1.05 postpaid. The Inventory will be interesting, and it is also copied in full. Genealogically, Benjamin Hollingsworth of Benton (now Calhoun) County, Alabama, was the son of Jacob⁴ and Mary (Brooks) Hollingsworth, (of Samuel³, Samuel², Valentine¹, of Henry^a) as catalogued in "Descendants of Valentine Hollingsworth, Sr.," by J. Adger Stewart, at pages 145 and 146. Wiley B. Hollingsworth, Ben's son, died the year his will was written, and mention of the administration is made in Ben's inventory. Ben's wife was Joicy Jones. She is not mentioned by Stewart. They married Sept. 3, 1809 in Franklin County, Georgia - See HR 2:103 - and mention of Benjamin is made in the will of Jacob⁴ Hollingsworth, dated 15 May 1815 (HR 2:104,105.) They emigrated to Franklin County, Tennessee. Son Stephen Perry Hollingsworth went to Rusk County, Texas. (HR 1:66) Joicy also moved out there. She appears in the 1850 census at page 506, in Rusk County, aged 58, with sons Benjamin, Benton, and Orlando (HR 1:67). The family had moved from Tennessee to Alabama in 1832, according to Mr. Stewart. Benton Hollingsworth, age 20 in 1850, was born in Tennessee, while Orlando (Newton) his brother, age 13, was born in Alabama.

I Benjamin Hollingsworth having a long journey in view and expect to start on the second Inst, feel it right to make constitute and ordain this my Will and Testament, being conscious that I must go the way of all the Earth and I feel to say amen, believing in the Immortality of the soul and that God governs all things in heaven and Earth after the Council of his ow (sic) Will.

And believing it is my provinc to Dispose of my Earthly goods as I may think right, I therefore Leave all my Earthly affairs in the hands and power of my Wife Joicy Hollingsworth and I Do not require her by any means to be compell'd to give security.

1st I request her to pay all my debts

2nd To see that Benjamin Benton and Orlando, out of our Effects receive as much Education as any of our Children has had, then if there is any thing to be Divided Let it be Done in the following manner Ar-senath and Doctor Allen have had a full share of my Estate Stephen and Wyly in his life time both have had about seven hundred Dollars a piece that is what I have paid for them included (sic?)

(Second sheet) Now when Mary An Kelly Hannah Balzare Benjamin Benton & Orlando shall have receiv'd the amount of seven hundred Dollars a share, then the ballance to be Equally Divided between Stephen Mary Belzare (sic) Benjamin Benton Orlando and my grandson Thomas Hollingsworth son of Wyly B Hollingsworth and in case of his Death before he becomes of age his portion if any Decends to Benjamin Benton & Orlando. (Sic: There are no periods or commas. Underscores ours.)

I know that Arsenath Allen has had more than her proportionable part to wit one Negro girl and seven hundred Dollars in land one horse Bridle and sadle two cows &c But I wish it Destinctly understood that the younger children are not to be chargeable for their schooling and raising I further Declare and will that my wife is sole Executor and is to remain undisturbd after the Debts are paid in full possession of all my Estate so long as she may live only what part she may think proper to give to Each legatee

In Witness with my own hand I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and year above written

(NOTE: Stewart's book does not mention the daughters (not designated as 'daughters' any more than the sons are called 'sons') to-wit: Arsenath Allen, Mary An Kelly, and Hannah Belzare. The names of Mary and Hannah seem to be accidentally merged in line 4 above. The will is all in one handwriting, and appears to be that of Benjamin himself. The name "William Davis" also by him, except the "x" and only Selena Box's name is written in a separate hand. The simulated seal is merged into the end of Ben's signature, indicating it was put there before he signed, and he signed too far over.)

INDIANA HOLLINGSWORTHS IN 1860

When Hollingsworth Register (then called "The Hollingsworth Register") opened in April of 1965 - hard to believe it is that long ago - in "elite" type, the first complete census of any state was then given. It was the 1850 for Indiana. Later we found out that much of Marion County had been omitted due to the spelling used by the census taker in that county ... "Hollandsworth". We had been supplied with an index to these names from the complete typed index kept by the State Library, in Indianapolis. So, when things got straightened out, we published the omissions in the December 1966 issue. Now we give you, we hope, the entire reading of the 1860. This series (T-7) in the National Archives films is bad - so bad it has been re-filmed. But we did not use the new film, not having access. Nevertheless it appears that we have gotten all or nearly all Hollingsworths (all spellings) this time round. It took your editor 27 hours and 17 minutes to read the 13 rolls of film, over a period of about six months. On these 13 rolls are filmed the 36 volumes of the census books, containing, by

count, 35,047 pages with 40 lines per page! Remember: This census is not indexed, nor is it in any alphabetical order whatever. The following 17 pages of Hollingsworth Register No. 30 are a great gift to the researcher. It is our belief that Indiana contained more Hollingsworths per capita than anywhere else in the whole world at that time, even including any one shire in England. It has a sentimental attachment for your editor, because his great great grandfather, Frederick Hollingsworth, (1803-1869) married Elizabeth Brown at LaPorte, in the northern part of the state, on 17th April 1836.

(1) I. C. HOLLINGSWORTH - Fredonia (Kansas) Former Fredonia resident, Irvin C. Hollingsworth, died Friday night (14 Apr. 1972) in his home at Hutchinson. He was 69. Funeral services will be at 3:30 p.m. Monday at Hutchinson and graveside services will be at 11 a.m. Tuesday in the Fredonia Cemetery. The Rev. David Downing of the First Christian Church will officiate. Friends may call at the Cason-Knickerbocker Funeral Home at Fredonia after 6:30 p.m. Monday.

Hollingsworth was born on April 20, 1902, at La Harpe, and married Irma Cation on Aug. 10, 1930, at Chanute. At Fredonia, he was principal of the elementary school. The couple moved to Hutchinson in 1961. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge at Fredonia.

Survivors include the widow of the home; two sons, Maj. Gene Hollingsworth of Minot, N.D., and Earl Hollingsworth of Kansas City, Mo.; two brothers, Roy Hollingsworth of Dearborn, Mich., and DeMae Hollingsworth of Richmond, Calif.; two sisters, Mrs. Pearl Bales of Bartlesville, Okla., and Mrs. Minnie Fyfe of Pine Bluff, Wyo.; and four grandchildren. (Thanks to Mrs. George H. Colver, Coffeyville, Kansas. This is from The Coffeyville Daily Journal, Sun., April 16, 1972. HR invites its readers to submit up to date - or time worn and moth-eaten - clippings (cuttings, for you in the British Isles) on Hollingsworth obituaries. Any other spellings, too, for sure.)

(2) C. H. HOLLINGSWORTH DEAD. Charles H. Hollingsworth passed away at his home in Hampton (Franklin County, Iowa) last Tuesday afternoon at 5:30 o'clock (about 1910-1915 - Ed.) after two weeks' of confinement to his bed. Mr. Hollingsworth had been in failing health for several years, but it was not until the past two weeks

that he was unable to be up and around. He had been a resident of Hampton and Franklin County for many years and had many friends throughout the county.

Mr. Hollingsworth was born April 5, 1847, at Mount Carroll, Illinois, where he grew to manhood. When in his teens he enlisted in the Union army for service in the civil war and was one of the youngest members of his company. After his discharge from the army he returned to Mount Carroll and for some time worked as a telegraph operator in that city. He was married to Miss Sarah Elizabeth Might, at Sabula, Iowa, July 16, 1868. They moved to Freeport, Illinois, where Mr. Hollingsworth taught school for a few years. About forty-one years ago they moved to Iowa and located on his farm near Chapin. Mr. and Mrs. Hollingsworth retired from active farm life about 1890 and moved to Hampton, where Mrs. Hollingsworth passed away several years later. (See below - Ed.) Mr. Hollingsworth was married to Miss Liza Rierson, of Hampton, at Clear Lake, April 9, 1904, and they continued to make their home in Hampton. After moving to Hampton from his farm Mr. Hollingsworth built and sold several fine houses in this city.

The deceased is survived by one daughter, Mrs. S. M. Thomas, of Mason City. One son, S. W. Hollingsworth, preceded his father in death. Mr. Hollingsworth is also survived by one brother H. F. Hollingsworth, of Paona Colorado, and two sisters, Mrs. E. E. Roberts, of LaJolla, California, and Mrs. David Vought, of Hampton.

Funeral services will be held at the home Friday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, conducted by Rev. F. P. Blakemore. Burial will be made in the Hampton cemetery. (Courtesy of Mr. Douglas Hollingsworth of New York City. Charles H. Hollingsworth was the son of Mahlon W.⁷ Hollingsworth, of Robert⁶, Nathaniel⁵, Thomas⁴, Thomas³, Thomas², Valentin¹, of Henry^a. Descendants don't know for sure when he died. Probably cut from a Hampton, Iowa, newspaper. To see Charles in the 1850 and 1860 U.S. Census of Carroll County, Illinois, see HR 2:10 and 3:15, where he is age "1" (1850) and "13" respectively, each time in the family of Mahlon W. and Ophelia Hollingsworth.)

(3) Mrs. C. H. HOLLINGSWORTH - After a lingering and painful illness of three months, which she bore with remarkable fortitude and patience, Mrs. C. H. Hollingsworth passed from earth to the better world at 1:0'clock this (Wednesday) morning. Her maiden name was Sarah Elizabeth Might and she was born at Pittsburg, Pa., June 23, 1848. While a little child her father died, and when about eight years old she came west to make her home with an uncle, S. J. Campbell, at Mt. Carroll, Ill., where she grew to womanhood. Her mother came west subsequently and settled at Sabula, Iowa and here on the 16th of July, 1868, she was married to Charles H. Hollingsworth, who is left to mourn with the two children born to them, the irreparable loss of the wife and mother. The children are Samuel W., of Waverly, and Miss Birdie, a graduate of the Hampton high school of two years ago and yet at home. In 1882 the family became residents of Franklin county, locating on a farm in Richland Township, and about five years since they removed to Hampton, which has been their home with the exception of a season spent on the farm. Mrs. Hollingsworth was quiet and reserved in her ways and did not make new acquaintances readily, but to those who had the privilege of her friendship she was a true and valued friend, and was, in short, a person whom it was necessary to know well to fully appreciate. She was a devoted wife and mother, a kind neighbor and will be sincerely mourned by a wide circle of relatives and by

all who knew her. (Again, thanks to Douglas Hollingsworth. This obit is in good condition, judging by the Xerox copy. It dates from before 1904, the year of Mr. Hollingsworth's second marriage.)

(4) LEROCY HOLLANDSWORTH - Dies at Bill's Place on Highway 19. Leroy Hollandsworth Succumbs to Heart Disease on Eve of 71st Birthday.

Leroy Hollandsworth died unexpectedly at Bill's Place on Highway 19 south of Owensville (Missouri) Saturday night. Mr. Hollandsworth was spending the evening with friends at Bill's. He became ill suddenly and was taken outside where he died before a doctor could be called. His death was caused by heart disease. He died on the eve of his 71st birthday. Funeral services were held at the Gottenstroeter Funeral Home Tuesday afternoon followed by services at the Oak Hill church. Burial was made in the Church cemetery. Rev. H. E. Stahlhut conducted the services.

Mr. Hollandsworth is survived by one sister, Mrs. Zac Haddox, and a brother, Louis Hollandsworth. Mrs. Hollandsworth preceded him in death in 1929. He had been caretaker at Deer Leap Lodge south of Bem for the past ten years. He was born near Owensville on October 20, 1869, and was married to Mrs. Catherine Ridenhour, nee Warren, on September 22, 1920. (From the Gasconade County Republic, (Missouri) Thursday, Oct. 20, 1940. Mr. Hollandsworth died Saturday, Oct. 15.)

(5) Mrs. Fannie S. Hollingsworth. DESERTED WIFE'S END. YOUNG WOMAN, ABUSED AND THREATENED BY WRETCHED HUSBAND, SWALLOWS FATAL DOSE OF CARBOLIC ACID.

Deserted by her despicable wretch of a husband, who flaunted vile amour in her face, Mrs. Fannie S. Hollingsworth drank an ounce of carbolic acid Sunday morning (Oct. 13, 1903) at the home of her mother, Mrs. King, at No. 717 Commercial Street (Los Angeles) and died early yesterday morning at the county hospital.

The testimony elicited at the Coroner's inquest at Pierce Bros. morgue yesterday evening brands Charles D. Hollingsworth, the woman's husband, as the real murderer. Two years ago, Hollingsworth deserted his wife, then 20 years of age, for another woman. During the 2 yrs. the scoundrel has introduced this mistress as his wife. She bore him a child. Mrs. Hollingsworth secured a position in a south Broadway manicure establishment and might have forgotten her husband, but he warded off any such contingency by hounding and abusing her most brutally. He often threatened to kill her. Once he visited his wife in her home and drew a revolver to kill her, but it was torn from his grasp by a young man in the house who heard his loud threats.

Early Sunday morning Hollingsworth visited the Commercial Street home and renewed his abuse. When he left, the utterly wearied and despairing young woman took the poison.

Hollingsworth is a paper hanger, living at No. 210 E. 5th Street. The testimony of Mrs. Hollingsworth's sister and a young man rooming at the house was very positive to the above effect. (From the Los Angeles Times, Oct. 14, 1903. Charles Darling Hollingsworth was the 8th child of Edward Earl and Rachel McFadden Hollingsworth. He was this writer's granduncle, the "Black Sheep of the Family." Do you wonder why? But, really, all of the 'testimony' above, in that even then disreputable newspaper (worse now) is one-sided. All the facts are not given in. No modern day paper would dare make such remarks. Mrs. Hollingsworth's maiden name was Lindsay. See HR 4:111-113.)

Shame On You, Rachel!

Mr. Douglas Hollingsworth of New York City calls our attention to this sly matron and her rank fraud. Keep in mind that she was not a Hollingsworth by birth (our Charlie was!) just to keep the slate clean.

The following letter was discovered by Mr. Hollingsworth while he was looking through the Civil War Pension record of one Josephus J. Hollingsworth, son of John Edward & Rachel (Harn) Hollingsworth, of St. Mary's Ohio. Josephus died of disease in 1862, which he contracted during the Tennessee campaigns. His father died in 1863. Then, in the late eighties, Rachel applied for and received a pension on her son's services, claiming she was now destitute and had been partially dependent upon her son Josephus at the time of his death. The stipend was granted to her. Then came the furor in St. Mary's, and this letter:

HEADQUARTERS, Kishler Post, No. 83, Department of Ohio, Grand Army of the Republic (H.S. Marshall, Adj't, J. J. Hollingsworth, Commd'r, Fred Heusch, Q. M.)

St. Marys, Ohio, Aug. 12th 1893

Dear Sir:

For some time I have been thinking of reporting a claim here that does not come under the Pension Law and that is the widow Rachel Hollingsworth. She claims that her son was her support before the war which is not so, her husband was living at that time, and he was an industrious mechanic and laid up money and realty, and she has several acres of land here that she has been offered \$600.00 an acre, besides she lives in a good brick house and rents part of it and her representatives, her son and son in law, can support her and not miss the money. her claim was worked through by an unprincipled Agent by the name of James M. Graham that moved to Kansas, he should been silenced long ago. there are others here drawing big pensions, through fraud that should have their pensions cut down.

Well, as Mr. Douglas Hollingsworth informs us, the Pension Office investigated, and found that Mrs. Rachel Hollingsworth was one of the wealthiest ladies in St. Marys, and at no time did she depend on the support of Josephus Hollingsworth. The pension was eventually revoked. Josephus J. Hollingsworth was son of John Edward⁷; Jehu⁶, John⁵, Thomas⁴, Thomas³, Thomas², Valentin¹, Henry^a. See H.R. Vol 5, page 108, for the census reading (1850) showing Josephus, 8, in the home of his parents, John E. (36) and Rachel (33) Hollingsworth, with Louisa Harm, a relative of "our subject," and the other children. See also Stewart's book, page 101.

Dear Mr. Hollingsworth:

Thank you for your letter regarding the History of the Hollingsworths. In regard to the history of my family, the following information is given to the best of my knowledge and hope that you can help me find some of my relation.

My father's name is John Herman Hollingsworth, he is now 65 years of age and lives in Marinette, Wisconsin. My mother's name was Cleo Hamblin, she also lives in Marinette, Wisconsin, I have two brothers and one sister: (1) John William Hollingsworth that lives in Kenosha, Wisconsin. He is married and has one son. (2) Marshall Donald Hollingsworth that lives near Los Angeles in California. He is married and has four daughters. (3) Eunice Marie Hollingsworth. She married James Foley and lives in Menominee, Michigan. She has two sons. I married Evelyn Samson and have two Daughters, Karen & Nancy.

My father, John H. Hollingsworth was born in 1895 near Springfield, Missouri. His father's name is unknown but was called Add- Which could stand for anything. His mother's name was Rebecca. When his father died he was placed in an Orphanage at Shelbyville, Illinois. He lost track of his eight Brothers and two Sisters. His brothers' names were Charles, Tom, George, Edward, William, James, Sylvester (sic) and Louis. His sisters' names were Bertha and Olethia. We found out that Olethia was dead but have not been able to trace any of the others. I hope you can help us.

This is the extent of our knowledge as to the Hollingsworths. I have tried for several years to trace out some of them but it seems that the court house at Springfield burned down around 1900 and the records

burned also. I have written to quite a few Hollingsworths in hopes it would be some relation to us but have not succeeded. I hope to talk to Mrs. Wallace this week and will attempt to take down all the information regarding Samuel Hollingsworth and will write you regarding this as soon (as) possible and will also see what condition the pictures are in and attempt to have them reproduced for you.

May I hear from you.

Comment: We never heard from the gentleman again. This was during the first phase of our research, trying to trace our own family. Of course, we eventually did obtain "the pictures" and the information from Mrs. Olive Wallace, already long ago published here. But we do not know if Mr. J. A. Hollingsworth ever solved his problem, although we explained we could not, at that time - and still cannot - help him. If any reader can supply the data on the father and mother of John Herman Hollingsworth - "Add and Rebecca," do write. Come to think of it, if they had as many as eleven children, which usually takes almost 25 years to beget, they ought to be findable in the 1880 census schedules, with some of the children listed.

In our article, The Cloptons and the Hollingsworths, appearing on page 33 of this volume, we made the statement that the royal lineages from Charlemagne, et al, come down only through Dr. Ben F. Hollingsworth's wife, Mary Ann Mimms. This is not true. Thanks to the care of Mrs. Gail S. Moreman, daughter of Mrs. Kathleen (Hollingsworth) Smith, our faithful subscriber, we can announce that the reader can consult J. A. Stewart's book "Descendants of Valentine Hollingsworth, Sr.," pages 111-113, and find the other connections. Jephtha Hollingsworth had two of his five sons, Samuel Gordon and Benjamin Franklin, marry sisters. Ben married Mary Mims, or Mimms, and Samuel married Susan Mimms. By Susan, Sam had three daughters, Helen, who married David Gordon; Josephine, who married Dr. Charles Palmer, and Susie (Susan) who married Charles C. Faris. These all had issue, most of whom were living in 1918 when Stewart was making enquiries.

(((((((Thomas J. Hollingsworth, M.D.)))))))))

Although only establishing himself at South Haven (Kansas-Ed.) in December, 1888, Dr. Hollingsworth has already succeeded in building up a good practice, this being done by a strict attention to the duties of his profession, and his attitude as the encourager of those movements and enterprises calculated for the good of the community. He was born in Clay County, Missouri, Sept. 1, 1854, and obtained his preliminary education in Wyandotte County, this State. Later he attended the State University of Missouri, from the medical department of which he was graduated in 1877. He began the practice of his profession in Wyandotte County, and later followed it in Kansas City, Mo., and in the city of the same name in this State. From the latter he removed to South Haven.

Of Southern antecedents, Dr. Hollingsworth is the son of Jephtha H. and Sarah F. (Jessup) Hollingsworth, who were natives of Todd County, Kentucky. They removed to Missouri in the spring of 1853, and located in Clay County. The elder Hollingsworth organized the first Battalion of the Confederate soldiers in Bates County, of which county he was at that time resident. A short time afterward he removed his family to Collin County, Texas, while he remained in the service until the close of the war, acting under a Captain's commission. Then returning to Platte County, Missouri, he engaged in stock-raising two years. Next he sold out, and coming to Kansas, located in Wyandotte County, where he was interested in live stock until his death May 27, 1888, at the age of fifty-nine years. The wife and mother died at the home farm March 4, 1884. The elder Hollingsworth was a well educated man, having been graduated from the Louisville Law University, and he for a number of years was engaged in the practice of law in Kentucky and Missouri.

The mother of our subject was a niece of Gen. Thomas S. Jessup, who was at one time a member of the Kentucky Legislature, and later represented his district in Congress at Washington, in which city he died many years ago. She was carefully educated, completing her studies at a Female Seminary in Greenwood, Kentucky. She united with the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at the age of sixteen years, to the faith of which she consistently adhered until her death. The father of our subject was a member of the Missionary Baptist Church, with which he identified himself at the age of twenty years, and in which he was an earnest worker from that time on.

The paternal grandfather of our subject, Jephtha Hollingsworth, Sr., was a native of South Carolina, and traced his ancestry to Scotland. * He was left an orphan when a mere child. When reaching man's estate he settled in Kentucky and was married to Miss Mary Gordon, who was born there. They lived in the Blue Grass regions many years, but finally removed to Missouri where they spent their last days. Grandmother Hollingsworth was a member of the Baptist Church. On the maternal side Grandfather William Jessup was a native of Ireland, and closely related to the O'Connells of that country. He emigrated to America when quite young, and was married in Kentucky, where he reared a family and died.

Dr. Hollingsworth of this sketch was married in Chicago, Ill., Nov. 29, 1881, to Miss Lois Kenyon Fellows, daughter of Mrs. Mary K. Fellows. Mrs. Hollingsworth was born Sept. 27, 1861, in Syracuse, New York, of parents who were natives of New York. To the Doctor and his good wife there have been born three children, the eldest of whom, Jephtha B., died young. The survivors are Albert B. and Lola M. F. The Doctor affiliates with the Democratic party, and is a member of Pomeroy Lodge, No. 88, I. O. O. F., at Pomeroy, this State. (From Portrait & Biographical Album of Sumner County, Kansas (1890: Chapman Brothers, Chicago) page 377.)

*The Scottish ancestry probably refers to that of the Gordons. Jephtha was son of another Jephtha Hollingsworth, and Nancy Gordon his wife, probably some relative of Jephtha Junior's wife Mary. The Gordons are obviously a Scottish family, while we know full well that Jephtha is a direct descendant of Valentine Hollingsworth. For additional material, See Stewart's book, page 111.

More About Isaac Hollingsworth of Mississippi

Mrs. H. M. (Hollingsworth) Hamman of 1010 West Oak Avenue, Jonesboro, Arkansas, is a descendant of Isaac Hollingsworth (1780-1866) of Newton County, Mississippi. We have published several articles over the years, in HR, about him. No solution to his parentage or exact origin in North Carolina, has been found. It is not in this article, either. Sorry. But Mrs. Hamman has added some more to our knowledge of Ike's children. She is the great-granddaughter of Robert - alias Robin- Hollingsworth, son of Isaac, through Samuel, Robert's son. She has submitted a family group chart, in her letter of 10th of April, this year, which is of interest. Here is a copy:

Mrs. Hamman remarks "As you can see I lack a lot on this sheet. There are at least 1 boy and 1 girl missing - I believe the boy was Abraham (in Covich County Census 1850 - See HR 1:136 but not so - Editor) and the girl may be Jemima who is said to have married John Smith. I have no proof at all."

Please see Hollingsworth Register, 3:1-6 for the editor's theoretical list of Isaac's children, written in 1967, which was rather behind the times. Our subscriber and contributor, Mrs. Leola Rayborn, advises us that tradition in her family - she also is a descendant of Robin Hollingsworth - has old Isaac married to a Smith named Jemima, daughter of John Smith. Remember, too, that one of Ike's children, the only one we know who had a second given name - was called "William Smith Hollingsworth." Your editor, a professional genealogist, will stand behind this fact and say it is very significant!

A Misplaced Hollingsworth Will

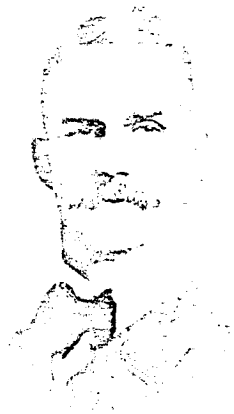
The late Robert Glen Peterson, a valued friend, gave your editor the abstract of the will of William Hollingsworth, copied as he gave it, below, several years ago. William Hollingsworth appears in the 1850 census of Tippecanoe County, Indiana, with nearly all of his children. See HR Vol. 1, page 33. There his age is 64, born in South Carolina. Stewart's book, page 70, shows that he had 12 children in all, some dying before his own death. He was the son of Joseph⁵ and Margaret (Hammer) Hollingsworth (George, Abraham, Thomas, Valentine, Henry,) born 18 Jan. 1785 in Ohio; died 24 Sept. 1855. According to this will's location - Hardin County, Iowa - the man must have died there, or had property there. We have no information whether this is the original, or an exemplification (copy) of the will, or if a copy or the original is still kept in Tippecanoe County. But, in any case it is now published.

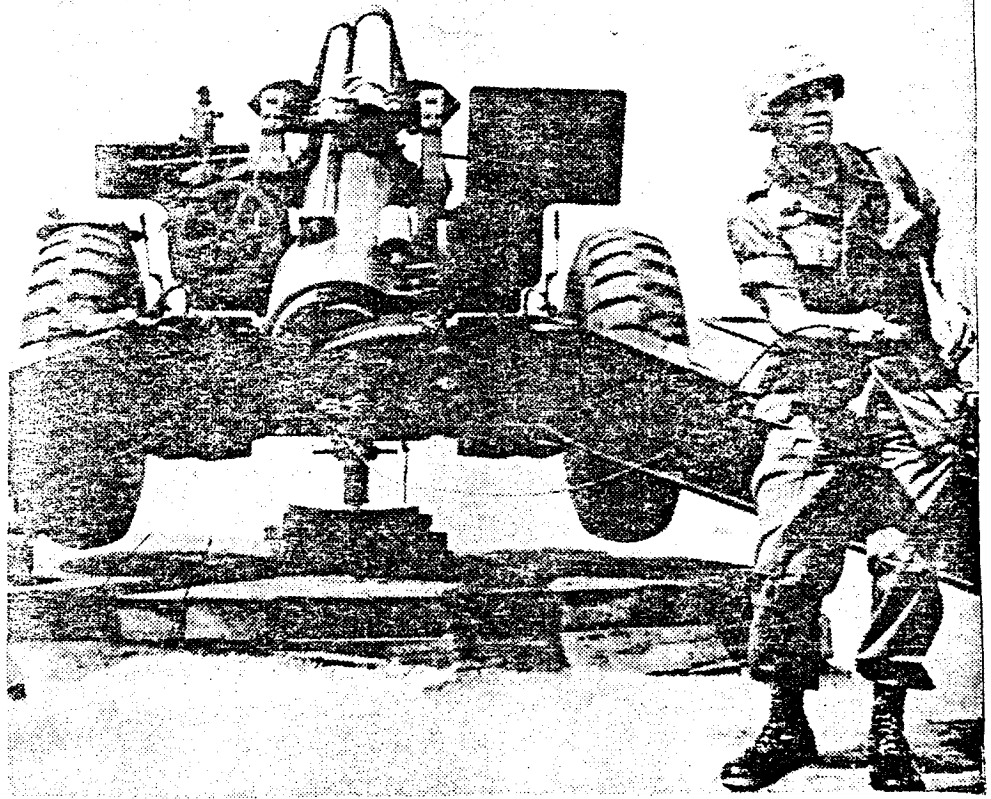

Children: John, Elihu, Milton, Olive (Note: in HR 1: 33 we erred, calling this child 'Oliver' thus changing the sex), H. Kelly, Hannah Hawkins, Eli, Josephus and Addison Hollingsworth; Grandchildren: Sarah Adalene Holeman, Aseneth Holeman and William Hollingsworth. Witnesses: Sanford C. Cox, Buddle Sluper and Benjamin Hollingsworth. Executor: Nephew Amos Hollingsworth.'

FREDERICK HOLLINGSWORTH FAMILY - GENERATION FOUR - CONTINUED

William James⁴ Hollingsworth

The youngest son of Frederick and Elizabeth (Firsich) Hollingsworth, born 6 Nov. 1899, in Los Angeles, California, died 24 June 1954, at 9:12 p.m. of a cerebral hemorrhage (stroke) in the same city, aged 54 years, 7 months and 18 days. He is buried in Holy Cross Cemetery, Los Angeles.

Billy Hollingsworth lived a varied life. Being a bachelor, he had more room to show his talents. He played baseball, but ill health prevented his becoming a pro player. He had musical talents, too, like some of his Irish ancestors, and was a night-club musician, being accomplished at the piano and the drums. We published his photo in the plate opposite page 22 in our March 1972 issue (incorrectly submarked "1897-1954") taken from one of his publicity cards. He also worked as a salesman, and his last work was selling real estate.

He was a very personable man, well known and liked by the family. For most of his life he lived with his mother at the family residence 717 West 52nd Place, Los Angeles.

It is not known where he received his names, if from any member of the family. But it is known that one of the cousins from the Wexford family, Charlotte Hollingsworth, daughter of John and Esther (Hollingsworth) Hollingsworth, a first cousin of his grandfather, had married William James, of Tullowclay, Co Wicklow, and moved to somewhere in America before John Hollingsworth died in 1863. If Frederick Hollingsworth, Billy's father, met these people, it might be that Bill was named after William James. Does anybody know?

SOMERSET HOUSE BIRTHS - PART ONE

This is to be considered Part Two of "Vital Records At Somerset House" begun at page 9 of our March, 1969 issue, where marriages, Hollingsworth (Hollinsworth, Hollingworth, etc.) names only, were presented from 1842 first quarter through 1845 fourth quarter. In those days, the local branch of LDS Library had only segments of these records on film. Now a larger portion is available. We start the births here, giving name of child (that is all the index shows: it is the lousiest index under heaven - pardon the bold truth) followed by the registration district, and then the volume and page. The cost of a copy of any item is \$2.00, directed to the Registrar, H.M. Register Office, Somerset House, London. Give the year, the quarter, the volume, the page, the name, and the district, and ask for airmail return. Send your fee (preferably by American Express Money Order) in airmail cover @ 21¢ per half ounce. If you don't, your reply could take as long as 12 weeks to get to you. Our precious bureaucratic red tape has brought us back to the schedules of the sailing ships, by Godfrey.

The Arklow Hollingsworth Family
(Part Five From Vol. 7, Page 151)

GENERATION FOUR - CONTINUED

Daniel⁴ Hollingsworth, believed to be the third son of John³ & (?) Hollingsworth, of Cronelusk, Arklow, Co Wicklow, Ireland, was born 11 April 1806, (Arklow?) Ireland; died 14 April 1884, in Escott Township, Leeds County, Ontario, Canada, aged 78 years, 3 days; buried in the Mallorytown Cemetery, near Brockville, Ontario.

He married, in Ontario, about 1845, a widow, Mrs. Honora, or Anne Eleanor Hyde, maiden name Manning. She was born 12 April 1820, "near Fermoy, Co Cork," Ireland; and died 3 Sept. 1897, at Escott, Ontario, aged 77 years, 4 months and 21 days; buried beside her husband. (This information from the 1851 census-HR 1:189; the church records of the Synod, see below; and the obituary and gravestone for Mrs. Hollingsworth, and stone for Daniel Hollingsworth.)

Obtaining information about this man and his family has been as difficult, if not moreso, than in the case of Samuel, his older brother, whom we spotlighted in the December, 1971, issue. But a good deal is available.

Daniel arrived in Canada in its youthful days, along with his brothers Samuel and Thomas. That was about 1835 or 1836. See HR 7: 150 for this information. His half of the land which he and Samuel purchased lay in the First Concession, Lot 15, Front of Escott. He quitclaimed it to Sam. By 1861, the family was in Lot 16, having a farm of 100 acres with just eight and a half of this under cultivation. The value of the farm was \$1,500. Their log house was built in 1850. See HR 1:191.

Now Honora Hyde was a Roman Catholic. The Census readings for 1851 and 1861 prove this. By her first husband, whose given name is not known to this writer, she had two daughters, Anne and Margaret Hyde. All three were Roman Catholics in 1851 but Anne and Margaret had converted to the Church of England ("Anglican") according to the 1861 census. Before 1871, Anne herself converted. This is unusual. In the United States, in recent times, the opposite is the commoner result. (Your editor once got a tongue-lashing from a priest because he is a non Catholic, whose mother is a life-long Roman Catholic. "Your mother let the Church down," he declared.) The five children born to Daniel by Anne Hollingsworth were all baptized in the Anglican Church at Gananoque by Rev. John Carroll, 19 Feb. 1862, along with three children of his brother Thomas. There is evidence here, not for any dissention over the choice of religion among the parents, but that the Anglican church had only missionaries in the area in

those days. The obituary of Anne Eleanor Hollingsworth states that she had lived in Ontario nearly 60 years, which, in 1897, would figure out to be shortly after her husband came to Canada. She was survived by seven children, four sons and three daughters. She was buried by the minister, Rev. C. J. Young, B.A., pastor of St. Paul's Anglican Church in Escott Township. (Complete copy at HR 2:k68.)

Of the 'seven children' alluded to in the obituary of Mrs. Hollingsworth, two of the daughters were by her first husband. But at any rate, all of the children survived the deaths of their parents. Interestingly, Margaret Hyde married Frederick Hollingsworth, son of Thomas & Alice (Robinson) Hollingsworth, who settled in Yonge Township about 1846-50, and Mary Hollingsworth, full daughter of Daniel, married Frederick's brother Nicholas! The son, John Hollingsworth, was also called David John, probably to avoid confusion, because there were plenty of John Hollingsworths in those parts.

Mr. Ira Mallory, formerly Township Clerk, advised this writer, that Anne Hyde's father was killed at a bee getting out lumber for the erection of his son Edward's home. We assume this refers to Dan Hollingsworth, Sr., who was Anne's step-father, of course. He was, according to this, struck by a sleigh-stake. His will was written 2 June 1874, and was proved in 1884, GR3-887, Surrogate's records, Leeds-Grenville County, Ontario. (HR 4:121) We have not found his obituary to check the cause of his death. Below is a rather incomplete list of his descendants. The children's generation is pretty thorough, but the grandchildren's is uncertain.

Issue of Daniel Hollingsworth by his wife Honora (Anne E.) Manning:

- (1) David John⁵ Hollingsworth, Born 24 August 1846 (baptism says "1848.") Escott; died 8 November 1907, Escott, aged "56" in the Township Records. Believed to have married twice; (?Second) wife: Susan Bowen, b. 1840 (Feb.) died 30 Jan. 1903 aged "62". Buried together in Mallorytown Cemetery.
No record of issue.
- (2) Daniel⁵ Hollingsworth, Jr., Born 20 August 1848 (baptism: "1850") Died in 20th century, buried Brockville Cemetery. Married, date unknown, Lenna Forester. No record of her birthdate or deathdate. (Letter 31 July 1969 Mrs. Lester Guild, Mallorytown.) To this union was born only one child, daughter Alice⁶, who married a cousin John Wesley Hollingsworth, from Co Derry, Ire. This information supplied by Alice and others. She was living in Brockville until recently; possibly still is. Daniel found out about a Hollingsworth relation in Ireland and paid for his passage so he could come out and marry Alice. He was a descendant of John Hollingsworth, Jr., of Ballycanew, which makes him a 4th cousin, or even a fifth cousin, of Alice. No issue.
- (3) Edward⁵ Hollingsworth, born January, 1850; Escott (baptism: "1852") died in the 1930s. Married, 27 Dec. 1893, Sarah Mallory. She died in 1940. Issue:
 1. Susan Gertrude⁶, b. 16 Oct 1894 died c1943.
 2. James Edward⁶, b. 28 Oct. 1895; bachelor living RR 1, Mallorytown, Ontario; farmer. (Had copies from old bible.)
 3. Mabel⁶, b. 9 June 1897; died unmarried June 1970.
 4. David John⁶, b. 19 Nov. 1898; died in infancy.

5. Hattie⁶, b. 28 Jan. 1900, Resides RR 1, Bath, Ontario, now Mrs. Hattie Bigham, our informant on this family. No children.
6. Lepha "Leafey"⁶, born 30 Jan. 1901; married D. J. Sharp. Is at 9 Findlay Ave. Ottawa, Ont. 2 children Ronald D. Sharp⁷ and Doris Sharp⁷
7. William⁶ born 17 Feb. 1902; died in infancy.
8. Margaret "Maggie"⁶, b. 12 Jan. 1903; died in infancy.
9. Mary Evelyn⁶, b. 27 Nov. 1904; living 7 Richardson Drive, Kingston, Ont. 1971. M. A. J. Latimer. Issue 2 children, Douglas James Latimer⁷ of Kingston; and Wayne J. Latimer⁷ of Cobalt, Ontario.

- (4) Mary⁵ Hollingsworth, born 19 May 1853, Escott. Died in 20th Century. Married, 4 May 1874, as 2nd wife, Nicholas Hollingsworth, son of Thomas & Alice (Robinson) Hollingsworth. Issue: Nicholas James⁶ (m Florence Miller) Edmonton; Daniel⁶, John⁶, both Winnepeg, Man.; Anne⁶ Church, Alice⁶, Fred⁶, late of Lyn, Ont. *
- (5) William John⁵ Hollingsworth, b. 17 Oct 1855, Escott; died 23 June 1909, do. aged "45". Married (1) Martha E. Davis, b. 1862 died 30 Oct. 1904 aged 42; (2) Cecelia Mallory (Hughes) (sic) died 21 Feb. 1907, Escott. Issue, 1 child known, Florence⁶, born 28 June 1908, supposedly living now in Rochester, New York.

Step-daughters, the children of his wife by Mr. Hyde. (Dr. Jekyll?)

- (1) Ann Hyde, born 1841, Canada, died 13 Dec. 1924, Escott, ae 83. Spinster. (Vital Records of Township Clerk.)
- (2) Margaret Hyde, b. 1843, Escott? m. 20 May 1872, Frederick J. Hollingsworth, son of Thomas & Alice (Robinson) Hollingsworth. Issue: 2 who died as infants; and Annie, Marguerite* & Thomas*, none of whom married. Thomas d. 21 Dec. 1969, Toronto. (HR 6:13)

See HR 2:163; and 4:83. The Census is not always accurate, but Edward Hollingsworth, above, was listed in the 1851 census as aged 1 year, therefore the baptism in 1862, giving birth as 1852, is an error, and impeaches some of the other information given too.

*All those marked with asterisk are deceased. For greater detail about Mary Hollingsworth Hollingsworth, and Margaret Hyde Hollingsworth, see our early article "Hollingsworths of Leeds County, Ontario," by Mrs. Marion Young, in HR 1:174, Dec. 1965. The Hollingsworth descendants of Thomas & Alice, of Yonge Township, Leeds County, Ont., are known to have called the descendants of Daniel, Thomas and Samuel Hollingsworth of Escott Township, same county, "The Lancashire Family." It was also stated that Mary Hollingsworth and her husband Nicholas were "not related." But the actual civil marriage record (photostat, no longer issued by Canadian authorities as Socialistic bureaucracy gets a tighter grip on freedom and public records) has a place in the "remarks" which shows that "the couple are 1st or 2nd cousins." Information was given by the witnesses. Actually, if our pedigree is correctly drawn, they were 2nd cousins, once removed on Mary's part.
