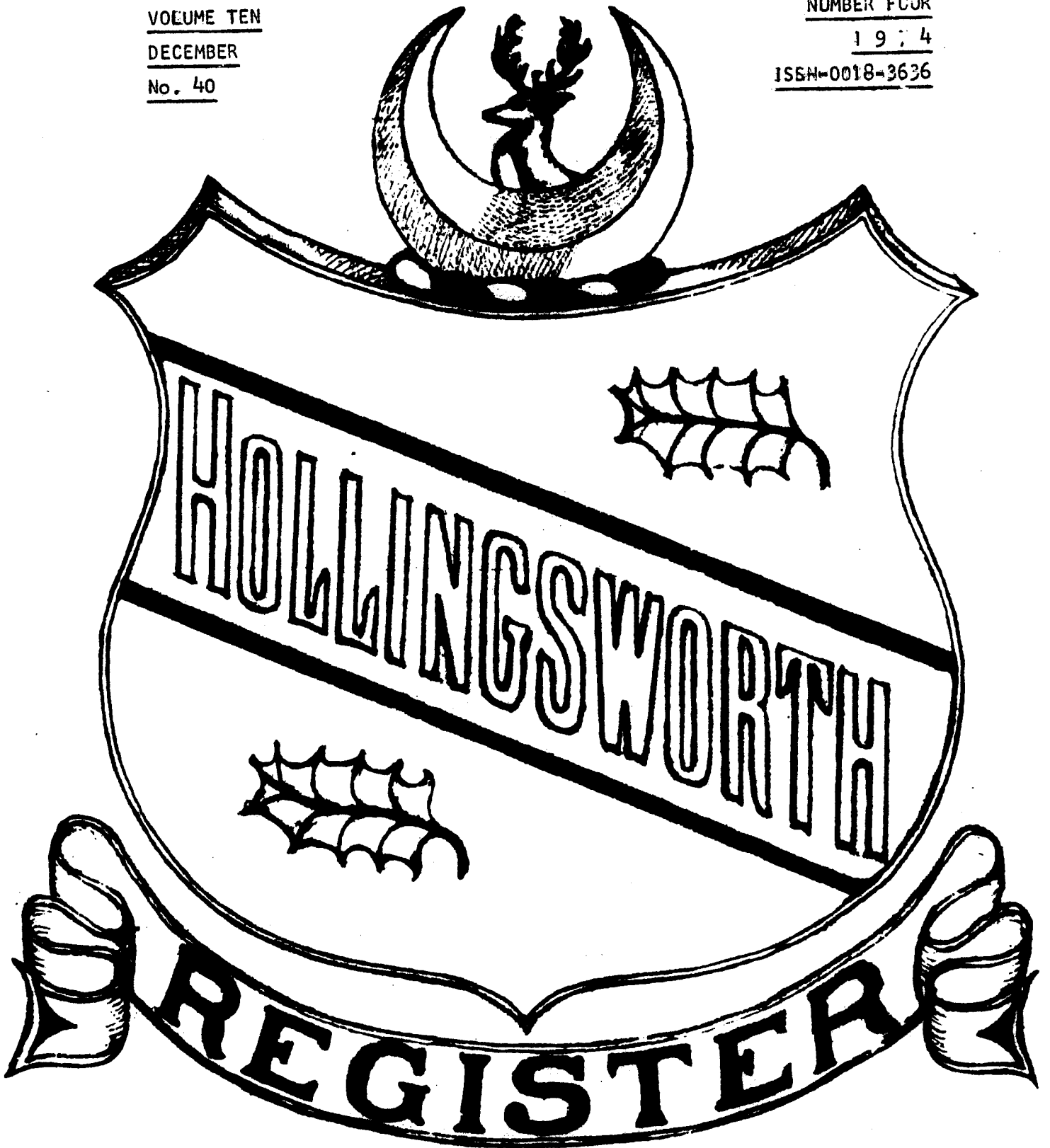

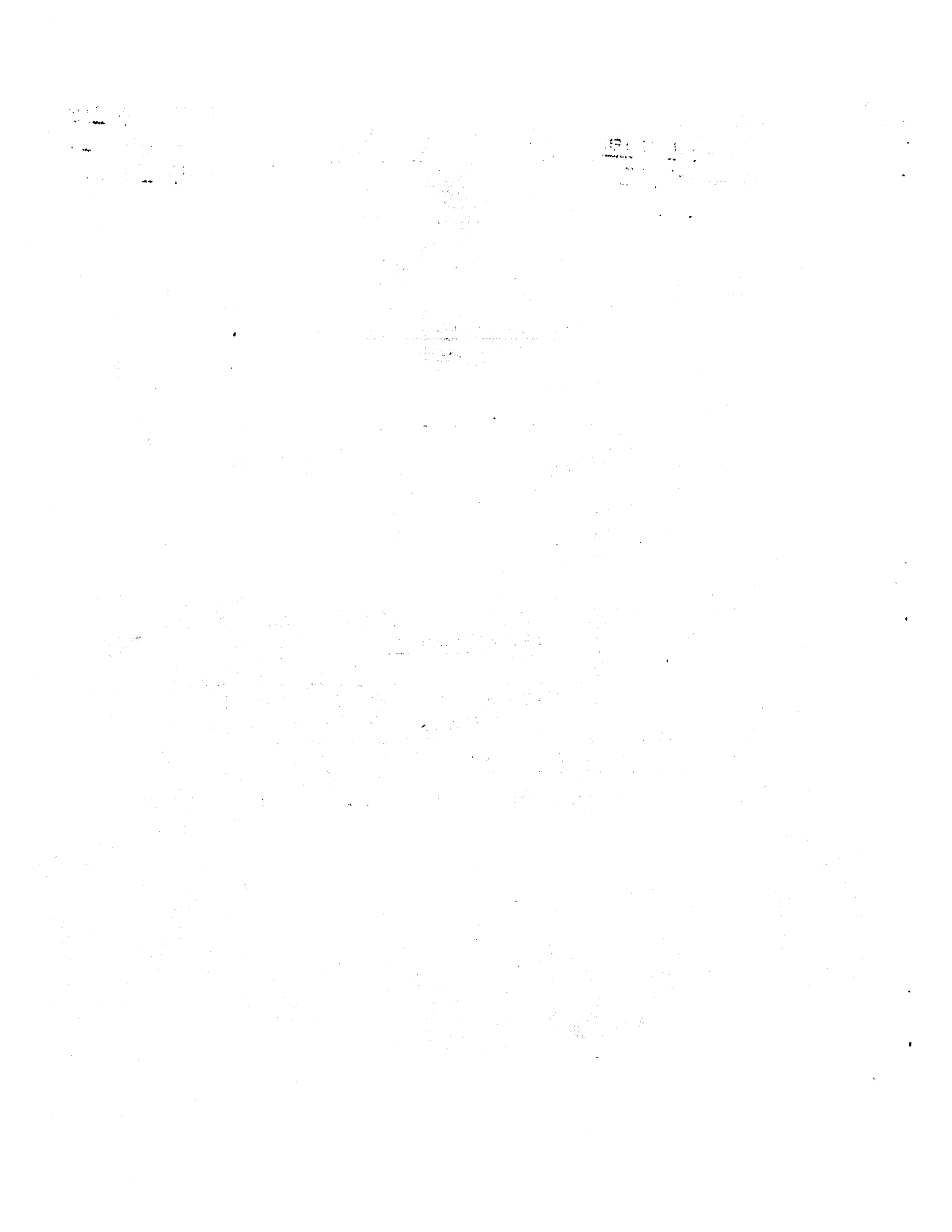

## MEANING OF THE NAME

The surname Hollingsworth is derived from a place in north east Cheshire, of the same name, called in the Domesday Book "Holisurde," and pronounced "Hollis-worth" but probably intended to be "Hollinworth." It is in the Parish of Mottram-in-Longdendale, not far from the city of Manchester. There are two other such place names, both in Lancashire, to the north-east of Manchester. It is possible that separate families sprang from the several places, bearing the same surname. The place in Cheshire was a bare waste in the time of Domesday (1086) and the first appearance of anybody using the name as a surname is in a charter of about 1215, where "Tomas De Holinewurth" is a signatory. The two Anglo-Saxon words, Holegn (or Holyn), a holly bush or tree, and Worp (or Worde) meaning an enclosure or farmstead, are said to be the bases to the placename Hollinworth, meaning, "A farm (homestead) enclosed by holly bushes," or "Holly Farm." In later years an "s" came to be used by some families, but that has not been found as a general rule earlier than about 1620. There are now five generally used forms: Hollingsworth, Hollinsworth, Hollinworth, Hollingworth, and Hollandsworth. These are to be found in the vital records, indexes of Somerset House, London, from 1837, and city and telephone directories of many large cities of the world.

## INTENT OF THIS QUARTERLY

Hollingsworth Register began in April, 1965, and its purpose remains as it was then: To publish abstracts or verbatim copies of as many records of the family, world-wide, from the earliest times until the present day, as is humanly and financially possible. In the first seven volumes of 28 separate issues, about 34,000 items have appeared in this behalf, an average of about twelve hundred records or items being published in each single issue. The entire U.S. Census schedules from 1790 through 1850 for these surnames have been completed, and the 1860 census is now in progress. No other family has been thus served. About one million pages were covered in that search alone.

MARTHA HOLLINSWORTH ROBINSON & SOME DESCENDANTS

Martha Hollinsworth was a daughter of John Hollinsworth of Ballinakill, a townland in the Parish of Ballycanew, County Wexford, Ireland, and of Elizabeth his wife. (HR 4:87) The date of her birth is unknown. The oldest register of the United parishes of Ballycanew and Kiltrisk perished in May, 1798, by deliberate action of the rebels who captured the village at that time, during the great rebellion. Her birth was probably before the year 1750. She was last known to be living according to my information, on 24 March 1803 at the probable age of 53. See my reference below to lease extract 442,049.

Martha Hollinsworth married, by licence granted at Ferns Diocesan Court, 1770, WILLIAM ROBINSON of Ballinclarey, Ballycanew (also known as Ballinacclare or Ballyclare). He was doubtless the son of Richard and Elizabeth Robinson of Ballinclarey, who held that farm under a lease dated 11 October 1738, made by the Right Honorable Richard, Earl of Anglesey, to said Richard Robinson, farmer, 69 and a half acres of the townland of Ballinclarey, in the Barony of Gorey, to hold for the natural lives of said Richard and of Elizabeth his wife and of Hugh Bolger, Junior, son of Hugh Bolger of Ballinclarey, at the annual rent of £17:7:6d. (Lease Memorial number 155,883, in Book 203, at page 384, Registry of Deeds.) William Robinson was probably born about 1745, at Ballinclarey, and was last of record 4 Dec. 1792 when he acted as a witness in a transaction on the estate administration of his father in law John Hollinsworth, lately then deceased. (HR 1:61 and 5:61.)

The origin of this particular Robinson family has escaped me as far as now. The above 1738 lease would indicate the first possession of that land, though not necessarily. Sometimes tenants lived for a time without benefit of lease, or had a former unregistered one which they surrendered in favor of a new and better one. But it is my feeling that in 1738 Richard was a young man, newly married, who was coming from elsewhere to start out with a good farm. He is listed again in a sequestration of the lands and tenants of the Earl of Anglesey in a Chancery case in 1742 (HR 6:157) and again in 1760 in the surviving vestry minute book of the parish. In this latter record it is shown that he sat in the same pew with the John Hollinsworth family. An excellent chance for William his son to get to know Martha Hollinsworth! (HR 6:113)

I have always thought that Richard Robinson was closely related to the family of Robinson in the parishes of Ballyanne, Clongeen and Old Ross, farther southward. The favorite given name in that family was Eusebius, or, short, Euseby! This one never shows up in the Ballycanew family, but, in the other family, the name of Richard does appear, at least once. The will of one Eusebius Robinson of Clonroche, Co. Wexford, dated 11 Dec. 1891 (sic) mentions his uncle Richard Robinson. This family is mentioned very early in this region. A marriage settlement of 1736 between Lord Loftus and Mary Hume, shows that Euseby Robinson and James Robinson were tenants on the lands of Rochestown which were being conveyed as a marriage portion. This was only two years earlier than Richard's lease at Ballinclarey.

Additionally, and most importantly, the other Robinson family were also related to my Hollinsworths. Martha Robinson's brother William Hollinsworth (1751-1827) was married to Eliza Jones. She had two sisters, Hannah, who married William Robinson of Kilbraney, Clongeen, Co Wexford, and Jane, who married Eusebius Robinson! (Will of John Jones, Abbeybraney, Co Wexford, dated 23 July, proved 10 August 1798.)

A brother of William Robinson may be the Thomas Robinson who took a licence to marry one Jane Tackaberry in Ferns Diocese in 1771. The Tackaberry family lived and worshipped in Ballycanew parish, and sat in the same pew with the brother of John Hollinsworth. (HR 6:113) John Hollinsworth himself was a well off farmer who was often a Church Warden in his church and a regular member of the vestry.

The last record I have proving that Martha Hollinsworth Robinson was alive is a lease dated 24 March 1803 as I alluded to above. It is registered in Book 638, at page 402 and is assigned Memorial Transcript Number 442,050 at the Registry of Deeds in the Kings Inns, Henrietta Street, Dublin. (Films of all these records are available at the Genealogical Society of Salt Lake City and to all its branches.) The text of this transcript is as follows:

Memorial of a lease dated 24 March 1803 whereby JOHN ROBINSON of Ushers Quay in the City of Dublin, merchant, let to JOHN BORBAGE (or BURBRIDGE) of Powerstown in the County of Dublin, farmer, a part of all those the Town and Lands of COOLOOK, then in the possession of WILLIAM SPARROW, being 45 acres and 3 roods, situated, lying and being in the Barony of Ballaghkeen, and in the County of Wexford, for and during the term of the life and lives of this said JOHN ROBINSON, and of MARTHA ROBINSON his mother, and of ELIZABETH ROBINSON his sister, then aged about 20 years, at the yearly rent of £67:2:2d per annum. Witnesses, GEORGE CARROLL, Gent., and WILLIAM EGAN, both of the said city.

This item is of value in other ways. It gives us the names of two of her children, John and Elizabeth, and gives approximate birth year for the latter. From other evidence in my possession, compared with this, I am sure that the above John Borbage or Burbridge the lessee, was a first cousin to John Robinson, probably being a son of Edward Burbridge and his wife Elizabeth, nee Hollinsworth, younger sister of Martha. Coolook was the same area as Ballycanew, and, in fact, was the same as Coolookbeg, the home of Samuel Hollinsworth, brother of Martha's father. As an additional sidelight, about the time of the above 1803 lease, John Robinson had as his apprentice, his other first cousin, Edward Hollinsworth, or Hollingsworth, son of Samuel of Ballinakill, said Samuel being my own great-great-great grandfather, and brother of Frederick Hollingsworth who 'made it all happen' for us here. Edward Hollingsworth later became a paper manufacturer in St. Michael's Hill, Dublin, a block from Ushers Quay. John Robinson was a paper merchant and also a wine merchant. George Carroll, the witness, was the father-in-law of John Robinson. Here, then, is a sketch of a generation or two of this Robinson family. I am sorry to say, I am unable to secure any record of other members of the family.

#### Issue of William and Martha (Hollinsworth) Robinson:

- (1) JOHN ROBINSON, born c1771, BallinCleary, Ballycanew, Co Wexford; died in Dublin. See sketch below.
- (2) ELIZABETH ROBINSON, born c. 1782, BallinCleary; alive 24 March 1803, aged 20 years; (lease op. cit.) No further information.

#### JOHN ROBINSON OF USHERS QUAY, WINEMERCHANT

Oldest son, and probably the only son, of William Robinson (of Richard) by his wife Martha Hollinsworth, (daughter of John) and was born about 1771, at BallinCleary, Parish of Ballycanew, Co. Wexford, Ireland, and died 9 January 1838 at his estate at Priest House near Sandymount, in the Parish of St. Mary's, Donnybrook, County Dublin,

at the age of about 67 years. His will abstract in the Irish Inland Revenue Ledger is the source of this date, though it writes "1837" I assume it means 1838, since the will was dated 9 Jan. 1838. He hardly would have returned from the tomb to do up his testamentary paper! Film 14475 part 10, Vol. 1838 page 12 G.S. Salt Lake City; he was probably buried in St. Mary, Donnybrook. I have not investigated this.

John Robinson's first wife is unknown. I assume she was the mother of his children. Their ages given in their official registered deaths indicate both were born prior to the marriage of John to Lydia Carroll.

John Robinson married (2) by licence issued by the Dublin Diocesan Registry, dated 24 May 1806, LYDIA CARROLL. They were married at the Parish Church of St. Thomas, Dublin, probably within a week of the above date. She was the daughter of George Carroll and his wife, nee Jane Irwin, who also married at this church by licence dated 29 August 1769. (Film 14448 part 125, G.S. Utah, Dublin Abstracts of Marriage Licences, from Phillipps MSS: 15237 to 1823, Gen. Office, Dublin, MS 475 Vol 1, p. 175; 3, p. 71.) (Note: Memorial 438,379, Vol 639 p. 53 Registry of Deeds, Dublin (Film 459,407 GS Utah) indicates that as of 26 July 1811, the wife of George Carroll, Dublin, Gent. was Lucia Dawson. I suppose this to be a second wife, but ne may be a brother-in-law, rather than the father-in-law, to John Robinson.)

Issue of John Robinson by first wife - name unknown:

(1) JOHN ROBINSON, born c1801, presumably at 24 Ushers Quay, Dublin; died 11 October 1872 age 71 years, at his domicile, Kiltalown (alias Kiltatown), Parish of Tallaght, Co Dublin. His family has a vault in that parish churchyard simply inscribed: FAMILY VAULT OF JOHN ROBINSON, J.P. OF KILLALOWN (sic) IN THIS PARISH. (Irish Genealogist, Vol. 4, No. 1, Oct. 1968 transcribed by Eric J. McAuliffe and Roderick J. O'Kelly-Lynch, pp. 29-36.) His wife's name was Eliza, but her surname is not certain. It was possibly Domville, or Domville, for John Robinson her husband received certain lands in Co Waterford 1 Feb. 1839, "as under the will of John Domville for 99 years etc." She was born c1805; and died 25 June 1879 at Rock Cottage, Dalkey, Co Dublin, home of her daughter Rebecca Finnemor, aged 74. (Film 555,052 Vol 14, 1853 # 69 GS Utah Deeds Dublin; Cal. of Probates, 1872, 1879.) The worth of John's estate was valued at £4,000 in 1872. An unadministered portion was granted to his daughter Mrs. Finnemor after his widow's death which amounted to £3,000 with the will annexed. I have not seen this will. He was a Justice of the Peace for Co Dublin, which in Ireland means he could oversee certain documents, etc., but could not marry persons, as in this country. I am hoping to trace living descendants of this man.

Issue: 1. JOHN DOMVILLE ROBINSON, of 15, Upper Mountjoy St., Dublin, Esquire, as of 25 July 1879 when he was granted administration on his deceased mother's personal estate of £450. (Cal Probates 1879 p. 629)

2. REBECCA ROBINSON, born 1832; married 1859, JOHN FINNEMOR(E). Only child, John Finnemore, Jr. Ballyward, County Wicklow, Esquire. He died 27 June 1897. Estate valued near £20,704.11.8d. His mother obtained administration or was executrix named in his will. He left his widow, nee Bertha Scovell, (marriage settlement 11 Feb. 1896) as shown by Schedule of Assets, Ireland, 1894-1904 # 33 (Film 584,472 GS Utah.)

(2) Rev. WILLIAM H. ROBINSON, born c1803, presumably 24 Ushers Quay, City of Dublin; died 9 Nov. 1887, at the Vicarage, Tallaght, Co Dublin, aged 84. (Tomb in Tallaght Churchyard, per Irish Genealogist, op. cit. page 35.)

Rev. William Robinson married, 1837, probably near Carmeen, Co. Roscommon, as marriage settlement is dated 5 April, prenuptial articles (Film 469,808 Vol 2 1838 deeds, Dublin) DOROTHEA IRWIN, daughter of John Irwin, Carmeen, Co Roscommon, Esq., by Elizabeth his wife, alias O'Malley (married by licence, Elphin Diocese, 1798). Dorothea Irwin Robinson was born Carmeen; died 28 Oct. 1874, Tallaght Glebe, Co Dublin; buried in family vault. (Op. cit.) Their marriage bond once existed in the Elphin Diocesan records; index film GS Utah Vol 1a, 1837. I do not know if John Irwin of Carmeen was in any way related to Jane Irwin, mother of Lydia Carroll, stepmother to Rev. Robinson, but it seems very likely - even more likely that his mother was a Carroll, sister to the 2nd wife.

Rev. William Robinson was Vicar of Tallaght Parish, County Dublin for 57 years! (Family vault inscription op. cit.) His estate in 1887 was valued at £20,149:15:9d, which is over a hundred thousand dollars in U.S. funds of that time. His father's estate in 1838 was more valuable - £29,810:15:3 as shown below. His will was proved at the Principal Registry, Dublin. A transcript of this has been deposited at the Public Record Office, Four Courts (T. 1718) and I intend to publish it here.

- Issue:
1. WILLIAM ROBINSON, "eldest son"; died Jan. 18, 1936, Kenilworth Road, Dublin. Named as executor in his father's will.
  2. IRWIN ROBINSON, "second son"; died 5 July 1913, Buenos Aires, Argentina.
  3. O'MALLEY ROBINSON, "youngest son" died 17 March 1918, River Dale, Terenure, County Dublin.
  4. VICTORIA ROBINSON, died 28 April 1930, Terenure.
  5. MARTHA ROBINSON, died 24 March 1932.
  6. EMELYE ROBINSON, died 9 July 1923.
  7. MARY REBECCA ROBINSON, born 1855; died 11 March 1862 age 7.
  8. MIRA ROBINSON, died 30 March 1887.
  9. DORA EDITH ROBINSON, died 3 May 1910.

The first six children are listed in that order in Canon J. B. Leslie's Biographical Succession List of the Clergy of Dublin Diocese according to a letter of 7 Aug 1969 from Representative Church Body, Church of Ireland, 52 St. Stephen's Green, Dublin. The others are mentioned by Leslie and are also found in the inscription in the family vault (op. cit.). The wife's death is found in the Irish Ecclesiastical Gazette.

Rev. William Robinson was tutored by Mr. Fenton, and entered Trinity College, Dublin, Oct. 18, 1819, at age 16. "son of John Robinson, Merchant, born in Dublin" and got his B.A. in 1824 and his M.A. in 1832. was Vicar of Tallaght 1830-1887. (Alumni Dublinenses, by T. U. Sadlier.) He participated in a number of cases before the Incumbered Estates Court, in lands held or petitioned for by Thomas Irwin and George James O'Malley, as heralded in the Irish Jurist, Vol 2, 1850 and 3, 1851.

Before I close I want to return to the subject of Martha Hollinsworth's son, John Robinson of Ushers Quay, Dublin. I feel that he figures greatly in the account of my own family, more than anyone I can think of, as a benefactor.

The last will and testament of John Robinson was dated 9 January, proved 27 Jan. 1838. It was proved in the Irish Prerogative Court, where more important wills, specifically, wills dealing with property "bona notabilia" or notable goods in more than one diocese valued at above five pounds sterling. This will, and all office copies perished in 1922 in the Four Courts fire. But the Commissioners of Inland or Internal Revenue made an abstract of it, in the 1838 volume, page 12. He is styled as of Sandymount, Co. Dublin, Esquire. But in the Prerogative Grant Book, 1831-1840, page 14, 1838, he is called John Robinson of Ushers Quay and Sandymount, Dublin, Esq. (Film 14465 part 6 GS Utah.) The estate was valued at under £32,000. His executors were John Robinson of Kiltalown, Co. Dublin and Revd. William Robinson, Tallaght Gate Co. Dublin, clerk, his two sons. All the property was equally divided between them. No description was abstracted, except the following Inventory brief: Household goods at £150; "In the Funds" at £5,791-0-7d; Leases £1,128:1:1d; In Public Companies, £1,114:17:3d; Securities £17,008:17:7d; and Cash and Rent £4,617:18:9d. Total: £29,810:15:3d. Two registered memorials of leases are of great interest:

Vol. 639 page 53, memorial 438,379. 26 July-27 July 1811. George Carroll, Dublin Gent., and Lucia his wife alias Dawson of one part and John Robinson, same city, merchant, of the other part. Reciting an indenture of 10 August 1765 of Right Hon. Charles Gardner to Michael Cullen, Garnidice, Co. Meath ... a piece of land on east side of Marlboro St., Dublin in the Lordship of St. Mary's Abbey for 999 years. This became vested in one Elinor Neynoe, widow of John Neynoe, late of Kevins Port, County Dublin, Esquire, by a deed of 25 Sept. 1776, William Dawson, Dublin, woolen draper and said Elinor Neynoe etc. (Dawson's wife must have been a daughter of Neynoe-HH) and the issue now living were, in 1811, Henry, Elinor and Lucia Dawson, the said Lucia Carroll, who has 1/3 part. This property to go to lessee, John Robinson after the death of Dawson and wife. Witnesses EDWARD HOLLINGSWORTH and William Egan, both of Dublin, gentlemen. Memorial witnessed by same, (Film 459,407 GS Utah.)

Vol. 765, page 439, (Film 467,074) Indenture of release, 22 Sept. 1821. Thomas Jones, Principal of Niet? Grove School, Rathfarnham, Co. Dublin, one part, and John Robinson, No. 24, Ushers Quay, City of Dublin, Merchant of the other part. Reciting a lease of 4 March 1726 (Film 461,323 SLC Vol. 52 page 430 No. 35,152 reg. 1727) by Edward Jacob, Sigginstown, Co. Wexford, Esq., to Edward Jones, Ballymenane, County Wexford, Gent., ... all that and those, the towns and lands of Coologes als Coolognmore, Jurse Tully's (farm) and the Ruff parks, 200 acres lying in the Parish of Kiltalown and Barony of Dallyaghkeen and County of Wexford for lives of David, Isaac & William Jones, sons of Edward, at £50 per annum &c... This property has now become legally vested in this said lessor, Thomas Jones, who now grants same to said John Robinson, townlands as in 1726 lease which had a clause for perpetual renewal. Now the new nominations, the lives of the said Thomas Jones, and of Edward Jones his youngest son aged 4 years, and William Robinson, aged about 16 years, son of John Robinson, 17 Ushers Quay, City of Dublin, paper and wine merchant, with renewal. Witnesses, Samuel Pineau, Samuel Stephens, both of St. Stephens Green, Dublin. Signed Thomas Jones, J. Robinson (Seal) Reg. 27 Sept. 1821. (1726 lease examined - H.H.)

The two addresses above seem to indicate that the lessee was John Robinson, the son, and the lease assignment was for the life of his brother, Rev. William. Also, the age of William, at sixteen would give his birthdate about 1805 rather than 1803. The interesting thing here, is, that this Coolook, alias Coolookmore was tenanted by Hollingsworths at this time and later. The Primary Valuation of Griffith, 1853, shows that John Robinson (Jr. of Kiltalown) holds several plots in Coolookmore, including lot 6, parts A and B, being House, offices and land, 47 acres, and more land in amount of 12 acres, leased to Catherine Hollingsworth, widow of Daniel Hollingsworth, Jr.

The above is on page 135, Valuation Books, Co Wexford, Union of Gorey, July 1853. (Now filmed by GS Utah.) Catherine was a Graham by birth, and Daniel Hollinsworth her husband was a son of Daniel and Ellenor (Spottiswoode???) Hollinsworth of Coolookbeg, Daniel Sr. being a son of old Samuel Hollinsworth of Coolookbeg, brother of John, the grandfather of John Robinson Sr. and great-grandfather of this John of Kiltalown. I wonder how a relative was to be a landlord? A tenant? The 1821 lease seems to have been the beginning of John's career in making his fortune.

John Robinson, Sr., of Ushers Quay, is listed in Lewis' Topographical Dictionary of Ireland, 1837, Vol 1, p. 179, in reference to Gentlemen's seats in Donnybrook Parish: "Priest House, of J. Robinson, Esq." Sandymount is a great sea resort.

Tennessee Research Tabulation: 8 rolls of film; 21 volumes of schedules; 21,530 pages of census schedules searched page by page (unindexed); 14 hours, 30 minutes actual research time, not counting tabulation, evaluation, etc.

As with most of the 1860 census, your editor has stopped along the way to note any oddities, such as strange names, and also to put down any schedules which give the birthplace by county, or exact place, if of foreign birth, and he also has noted all "poor houses," jails, asylums, convents and seminaries which have lists of names. This latter is by page and county only; the names are not copied. Also noted for future reference are all Irish settlements or Irish railroad crews, and military barracks or forts which list soldiers. Much of this census is faded rather badly. The most significant thing found while covering the 1860 schedules for Tennessee is the listing, names and ages and birthplaces, of every slave in Washington County. These slaves are listed in the families of their owners. It is an invaluable one, for any black studies or black genealogy student, for the Slave Schedules are not inclusive of names - only the names of the owners! Interestingly, the clerks at the U.S. Census Bureau carefully crossed out the names of all of these slaves, though not in any way oblitterating them, and making the note "Mr Norton will have a pencil mark hun through the record of slaves on schedule 1 and be governed in making the pay certificate by these entered in schedule 2."

Texas Research Tabulation: 6 Rolls of film (T-7, 280-285); 11 volumes of manuscript; 10,773 pages; Estimated (not counted) time of research: 6 hours research. Good film nearly throughout. Many counties consisted of merely one or two, or maybe of 16, or 35 pages. There are more counties in Texas than in any other state, and in 1860 there were 131 in all, but with almost no population to speak of in most. Your Editor completed this census at the time that Hollingsworth Register, Vol. 1, No. 1, April, 1965, was in the works, and consequently, he had to search around to find the notebooks in which he entered the results, and then make a complete re-check to see if he got the entries right. Also it was necessary to give the great detail (line numbers, date of census, etc.) which he did not keep in those days. This was really the second state ever searched in this survey, since Texas, 1850, was published in July, 1965, and Indiana, 1850, had been published in April, 1965 from indexes supplied by the Indiana State Library and no searching was done.

Elizabeth Hollingsworth Dole, daughter of Henry Lee and Ann Maria Hollingsworth was born in Buckingham, Quebec, Nov. 20, 1854. She passed on to her eternal reward on May 25, 1945 at the home of her daughter, Mrs. R. J. Quinn, Arkansas City, Kansas at the age of 90. To prepare us a dwelling place there.

In the sweet by and by,  
We shall meet on that beautiful shore.

While she can no longer join in the family gatherings here, she has been reunited with those who have gone before and awaits the day when all shall be gathered together in that land where there will be no more partings. \*

Mrs. Ramirez sent additional information, including the following: He was a son of the late William David Hollingsworth and Mahala Crane, and was active in the L.D.S. Church until the week he died, corresponding with friends all over the nation. He entered hospital for a kidney condition, but died of a heart attack while conversing with his wife on Wednesday evening. As a young man he had served in the U.S. Navy, and then, in 1916, in the Army on the Mexican Border, prior to service in the war. He was the youngest mine inspector in Alabama in 1925, and was awarded a small gold Safety Lantern for his watch chain in honor of his safety programs in the mines. He went to work for the Government in 1930 in the Civil Aeronautics Agency under the old Light House Service, and traversed Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana and Mississippi to inspect beacon lights for airplanes. He never took a day off from his job in World War II. He always kept in touch with his wife and children and even took them along at times, stressing the importance of family ties. He had the Hollingsworth "gift of gab" (which your editor has, but from his mother!) and was once mistaken for a man named George Hollingsworth of Long Beach, California, because he looked enough like him to be his twin. He was a Mason from early manhood. He wanted the family genealogy to be put in the records in Salt Lake City, hence, Mrs. Ramirez' work on the family of Giles Hollingsworth. He was a good man, says Mrs. Ramirez, in every sense of the word.)
